Saginaw divers assist trout project

Members of the Saginaw Underwater Explorers 61ub sunk a deep water discharge pipe in Devoe Lake Saturday in the latest stage of the Upper Rifle River Restoration Project. The 10-member dive team worked along the bottom of the lake in 40 feet of water and were assisted by officials from the state's Department of Natural Resources.

The pipe will allow cold water to discharge into the Upper Rifle River instead of lake surface water which reaches temperatures of 80 degrees in the mid-summer. Devoe Lake was poisoned in the fall of 1988 to remove trash fish and has since been planted with walleye fry and legal sized "Re* Band" rainbow trout.
