GUN!

On March 18, At least three police departments were chasing a car on South Washington; the driver being wanted for numerous felonies. Right in front of Saginaw City Hall, the driver lost control and crashed the vehicle. The driver exited the vehicle, and ran down Holland toward the river with at least two officers right behind him. At the bank of the river, the officers saw him throw a gun into the river. The subject was apprehended, and the Saginaw County Dive Team was called out. Performing an initial search on Friday evening, the search was called off till Saturday morning.

The commander of the dive team, Dave Sommers (a SUE member, as are most of the dive team) notified your Scoop editor of the continuing search. The following is a pictorial of Saturday's effort. It should be noted that the ice had just left the Saginaw River, and it was still a cold day in March.

The search plan was to start near shore; first a visual, then crawling and feeling in arc paths working outward. A left and right boundary was determined, and the searchers were guided by members on shore. As the water got too deep, it was time for SCUBA.

Searching was difficult; the river is not clear and stirs easily. Feeling across the bottom finds rocks, bottles, rebar, sticks, and typical junk. A silty bottom swallows the gun.

Saturday's search went on for about 4-5 hrs; unfortunately the gun wasn't found this day. The dive team did return for a third day, but almost immediately were paged for a "man fallen through the ice" call, and couldn't continue the search. State Police divers eventually were called in, and the gun was recovered.
