Tank Exhibit and Demo Scheduled

President Lisk was approached by Dennie McMann of the Saginaw County Sheriff's Dept. to participate in a campaign to raise money to send youngsters to camp. This is in cooperation with Tim Horton's Restaurants, and the event will be held at Tim Horton's in Shields. (Horton's is just down the road across from Meijers) The announced time is 10-2, but set-up will start at least by 9. Members are needed to be in the tank, and also answer questions from the public. This is really another opportunity to give our club some good PR, and perhaps be invited to other events. It's certainly a good cause.

Tentative Proposal.

Pres. Lisk has also been contacted by Don Comtose, who has been working on restoring the Saginaw River lighthouse as a museum. Some of you might remember Don as a speaker about the lighthouse at our club festival a year back.
