Cozumel Dive

Dave Sommers made a Cozumel trip about a month back, and he reports the hurricane damage is still evident.

"Got in 6 dives over Easter week. Went cruising in the Caribbean with a two tank dive in Ocho Rios, Jamaica, George Town, Grand Cayman and Cozumel. I had forgotten how clear the water can be especially when I splashed in at Grand Cayman and could see the bottom 100 feet down, and of course the dive boat could be seen from the bottom. There were all the usual fish and undersea attractions.

I had only done the Caribbean a couple of times before so it was a real treat, especially not having to wear a dry suit. In talking to some of the other divers and the dive masters, none had ever worn a dry suit. Some of the divers had been to Cozumel before and said the hurricane had caused a lot of damage. There were many dead trees on shore and damaged docks and piers. They said there was a lot of underwater damage with the coral covered in sand. I still thought the 2 drift dives in Cozumel were great." Incidentally, Dave got to meet Jean-Michael Cousteau who was recently in this area.
