Who's Swam With The Manatees?

Interesting article from National Geographic:

“Manatees Have Long-Distance Sense of Touch
New research suggests that manatees' tactile sense is so finely tuned that the animals may experience "touch at a distance" - an ability to "feel" objects and events in the water from relatively far away. In recent studies marine biologists found that the giant mammals are covered with special whisker-like hairs that act as sensors. Together these tactile hairs form a kind of sensory array, possibly allowing manatees to detect changes in current, water temperature and even tidal forces.”
