“Several things were discussed at our Jan meeting (10 members in attendance), and there are a couple of reminders:

We will utilize a new form for keeping VIP records, as well as newly serialized VIP stickers; both recommended by Dive Rescue International.

It was agreed that SUE VIP inspections will include a new O-ring for the valve to tank connection as part of the VIP. Dave will be ordering the rings for our VIP inspections.

· As of meeting time, SUE has 32 members: 4 past members did not renew as of yet. There is 1 new member app expected to arrive soon.

· Nominations for the Feb Election can be submitted through this month, up to Feb 14, the election meeting date. If you would like to be considered for a position on the board, please contact any current board member.

The election meeting is Feb 14. We may send out known nominations and current position holders ahead of time with proxy instructions or those that cannot make the meeting (it is Valentine's Day)

· There was some interest in scheduling an Ice Dive for SUE members this winter; Feb 19 seemed to be the best date. If you would like to participate, please notify Mike. Certified ice divers will be there to help and insure safety for this adventure. If you have always wondered what it would be like under the ice, or maybe have tried it and want to do it again, we welcome you for the experience. Give it a try...I know you'll love it!

· The annual (Seahorses) shipwreck film festival will be taking place on Feb 25. More details to follow, or contact Bill Atkins for information.

Ice Rescue Class

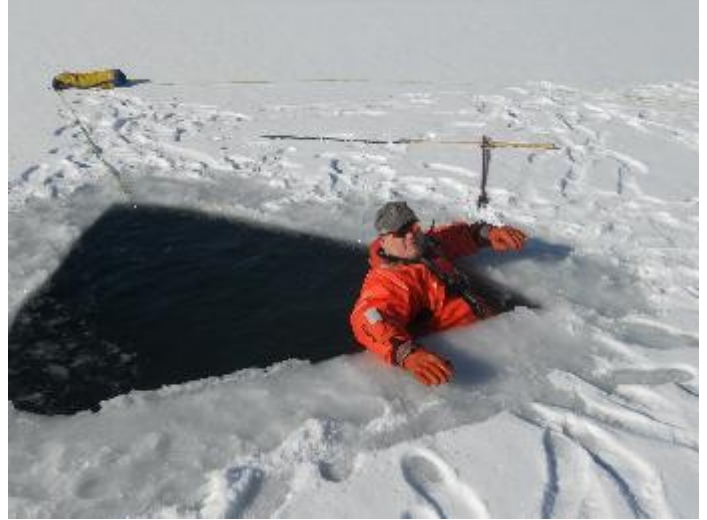
It's that time of the year when people tend to venture out on unsafe ice; if they fall through typically the local fire department is called for the rescue. A few weeks back Dave Sommers and Mike Fabish conducted this rescue training for a number of fire depts.; it was held at the lake at Roethke Park in Shields. Triangular holes were cut in the ice; each person took a turn in the hole as a 'victim'. Backed up by their 'team', a rescuer would crawl out to the 'victim' and assist them out by a number of means. First by handing them a pole to grab, then going in the water with them and secure them with a rope. The rest of the team then pulled them both out.

All participants were wearing the 'gumby' suits; waterproof and warm. The suits are buoyant enough to support the person in the water with no effort.

Diver Discovers Class Ring

Every scuba diver is really a treasure hunter; always on the lookout for the big find. Some are able to go to more elaborate means. A diver in Florida using an uw metal detector recently found a class ring (cover photo) from 1923, and tracked down its rightful owner.



Here's the story, as written by Christina Caron-

Louise Hearst's 1923 class ring, was found at the bottom of a spring in a housing community in Longwood, Fla.

Over nearly two decades of scuba diving, Reed Banjanin had come across several long-forgotten trinkets in the sand and silt, but none was more meaningful than one of his most recent discoveries: Louise Hearst's 1923 class ring.

He found the gold ring at a cave entrance last July about 25 feet below the surface of a Longwood, Fla., spring.

"I don't usually go down there with a metal detector," Banjanin said. "I was scouting around and got a hit and dug in the silt a little bit and there was the ring, sitting there."

Hearst's name was engraved on the inside of the ring after she graduated from Mississippi Women's College, which later changed its name to William Carey University.

"It's in absolute perfect condition," said Banjanin, who works at AT&T as an electronics technician. "Without a doubt the coolest thing I've ever found scuba diving."

And now, nearly a century after it was engraved, the ring has been reunited with Hearst's grandson, 75-year-old John Entzminger who lives more than 800 miles away in Oakton, Va.

So how did the ring come to rest in the Florida spring? Hearst's husband's family was from Seminole County, so it's believed that she lost the ring while visiting them and swimming in the spring, which was a popular spot.



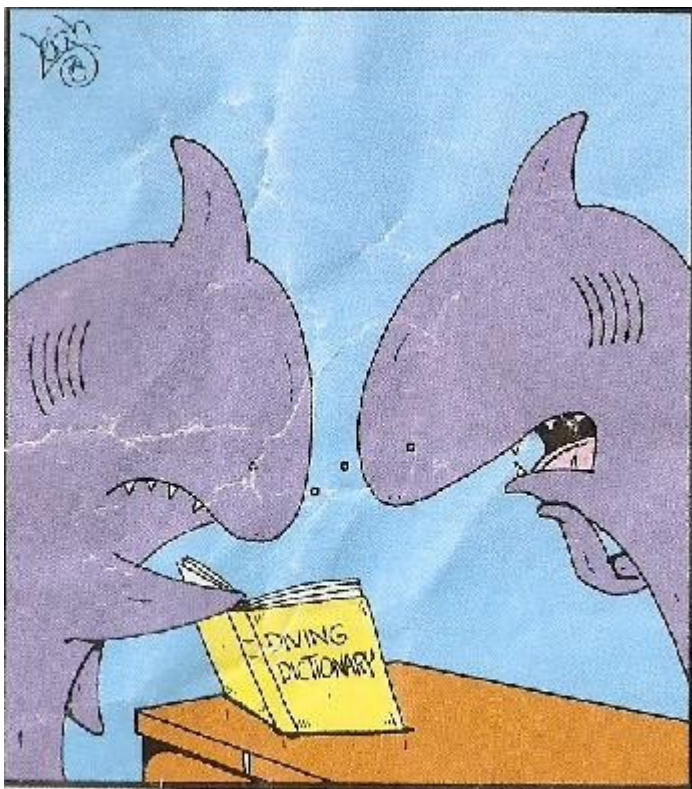

Finding Entzminger proved challenging for Banjanin, who began with an online search for Mississippi Women's College alumnae records, where he discovered Hearst was from Hattiesburg, Miss.

He discovered Hearst had lived in Forest County, Miss., and had married John Entzminger. She died in May 1975. With the help of findagrave.com, he located her relatives and eventually tracked down grandson John Entzminger in Virginia, who plans to give the ring to his grandchildren.

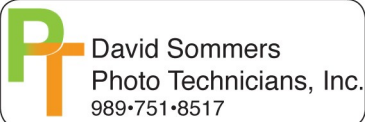
