



I really want to thank Wayne & Phil at the NOAA Thunder Bay site for spending the better part of an entire day with me last Friday. (I think Phil actually developed the 3D model you will see in the MP4 video). Both will tell you I'm really excited about the photogrammetry tools that can produce 3D dense point cloud models that are completely user interactive. I'm excited because this tool is CHEAP, EASY, and relatively fast to use. Once these models are completed they have the potential to provide measurement accuracy to a few millimeters' error. A fantastic archaeological tool for studying these sunken shipwrecks. I'm currently looking into how we might be able to use this tool to periodically "monitor" the status and degradation of these shipwrecks. More on that later. -Mike
